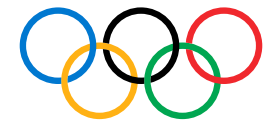

ATHLETICS COMPETITION

The Athletics competition of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games will be held from Thursday 1 August to Sunday 11 August. Track events, jumps and throws will be staged from 2 to 10 August at the Stade de France in Paris-Saint-Denis. The out-of-stadium events (race walking and marathon) will take place in the heart of Paris, in an exceptional setting. Race walk will open the programme on 1 August while the women's Marathon will close it on 11 August.

This competition will consist of the following 48 events:

→ Medal Events

Total number of medal events: 48

A total of 1,810 athletes, 905 men and 905 women, may take part in the Athletics competition.

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→ Qualification system

The qualification system for the Athletics competitions will be based on a dual pathway, with about 50% of athletes qualifying through entry standards and the remaining 50% qualifying through the World Rankings.

The qualification system approved by the World Athletics Council includes details of the qualification windows, targeted number of athletes per discipline and the required entry standards. For details on the qualification system, you can consult the [IOC website](#).

COMPETITION FORMAT

→ Track events

In principle, track events will consist of a maximum of three (3) rounds (first rounds, semi-finals and finals), with the number of rounds in each event based on the number of entrants.

There will be exceptions in the following:

- The men's and women's 10,000m events will be run as a direct final.
- For the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, and for the first time in the history of athletics a repechage round will be introduced for all the individual 200m to 1500m track events, including the Hurdles events. In this new repechage format, the athletes who do not qualify through their ranking in the first-round heats will have a second chance to qualify for the semi-finals by taking part in these repechage heats. Therefore, there will be no athletes qualified by time after the first round of the disciplines concerned by the repechage.
- A preliminary round will be held for the men's 100m and the women's 100m, which are traditionally the events with the highest number of entrants and the highest number of non-qualified athletes. This preliminary round will be held before the three (3) main rounds of the men's and women's 100m and will only be applicable for universality-place athletes. These universality places are awarded to NOCs with no qualified male or female athletes or relay teams. These NOCs will be authorised to enter their best male **or** female athlete in the 100m, 800m or Marathon. Athletes who successfully proceed through the 100m preliminary rounds will then compete in the heats and potentially in the next rounds, on the same basis and respecting the same rules as athletes who have met the qualification criteria.

→ Field events

All field events will consist of a qualifying round and a final. At the Technical Meeting on 31 July 2024 (18:00, on line), World Athletics' Technical Delegates will inform all teams of the performance levels required to advance to the final. If fewer than 12 athletes reach these entry standards, the next best-ranked athletes during qualifying will compete in the final, with up to a maximum of 12 athletes in each event. Exceptions can be made in the High Jump and Pole Vault competitions if the 12th place is shared at perfect equality by several athletes. In this case, more than 12 athletes could then qualify for the final.

→ Combined events

The men's Decathlon and women's Heptathlon will each be held over two (2) days, respectively 2-3 August and 8-9 August 2024, in accordance with World Athletics' regulations.

→ Road events

The Road events will be held in full outside the Stade de France on the streets of Paris and in the departments of Yvelines and Hauts-de-Seine.

RULES

The Athletics competition will be held in accordance with the editions of the following documents that are in force at the time of the Games:

In accordance with Rule 46 of the IOC Olympic Charter, World Athletics will be responsible for the control and direction of the Athletics competition at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

→ Start lists

The official start lists will be published the afternoon of the day before the relevant event.

For the first rounds of all events, athletes will be ordered according to their seed time/performance and allocated to their heat or group in accordance with World Athletics' competition rules.

→ Clothing and equipment

COMPETITION SCHEDULE

Spread over 11 days and 21 sessions (17 of which at the Stade de France), the Athletics schedule will open with the 20km Race Walk events on Thursday 1 August and will end with the Women's Marathon on the last day of the Games, Sunday 11 August 2024.

All track and field event finals will take place in the evening sessions, while the road events will be held in the morning, on four (4) different days.

Athletes who aim to double up on certain events (100m-200m, 800m-1500m, 1500m-5000m or 5000m-10,000m) can do so without having to compete in several different disciplines on the same day. Other events that can be doubled up include Long Jump and Triple Jump, Long Jump and High Jump and the 20km Race Walk and the Marathon Race Walk Mixed Relay.

COMPETITION VENUES

In addition to the five (5) road events that will be held on the streets of Paris, the Athletics' competition will be held at the Stade de France which will have a gross capacity of around 66,000 people during Paris 2024.

→ Stade de France (STA)

Stade de France - 93200 Saint-Denis - France

Built for the Football World Cup in 1998, the Stade de France is situated in the municipality of Saint-Denis, on the outskirts of Paris.

With more than 80,000 covered seats, the largest French stadium has hosted the biggest sporting events, including football, rugby and athletics, as well as major shows, since its inauguration.

The Stade de France will also host the Rugby 7 and Para Athletics events as well as the Olympic Games and the Paralympic Games Closing Ceremonies.

→ Field of play

The Field of Play at the Stade de France will offer the following:

- 400m 9-lane track (with the water jump for the 3000m Steeplechase on the inside of the track)
- four (4) high jump landing areas
- four (4) pole vault landing areas
- three (3) long jump/triple jump pits
- one (1) discus throw/hammer throw circle
- two (2) javelin throw runways
- four (4) shot put circles

The field of play and all the equipment will be presented in accordance with World Athletics' competition rules.

→ Facilities

There will be two (2) warm-up areas for the Olympic competition, both next to the Stade de France: the Stade de France annex stadium and the warmup area for throws in the Plaine-Saulnier zone.

The warm-up area for the running and horizontal jump events will contain a six (6)-lane 400m track; with eight (8) lanes in the 100m straight, plus Long Jump and Triple Jump pits.

The warm-up area for throwing events will include one (1) Javelin throw runway, one (1) Discus throw/Hammer throw circle (with a shared landing area) and two (2) Shot Put circles.

The competition venue will also have the following services and equipment:

- changing rooms and showers (separate men's/women's)
- lounge for athletes and officials
- Internet access
- physiotherapy, ice bath and other services for athletes
- secure space for equipment storage
- mixed zone for accredited media to interview athletes after their competition
- Technical Information Centre
- medical facilities
- doping control station

→ Hôtel de Ville (HDV)

The Hôtel de Ville and its eponymous square will host events in the very centre of France's capital during the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. This spot skirting the Seine and brimming with history will see the start of the Olympic games' most legendary long-distance race, the marathon.

You can't miss the Hôtel de Ville's imposing façade, which stretches 143 metres across and towers 18.80 metres high (26.80 metres at the corners, 50 metres if you include the bell tower). The existing neo-renaissance Hôtel was built by architects Théodore Ballu and Édouard Deperthes on the exact location where the former Hôtel de Ville stood until it was burnt down during the Paris Commune, in 1871. It has housed Paris' City Hall since 1357.

The Hôtel de Ville will be the starting point for the men's and women's Marathon Olympic events.

Transformed for the occasion, the site will offer the following areas for the athletes:

- pre-competition area (team tents)
- warm-up area
- medical area
- call room
- start line
- Technical Information Centre



→ Invalides (INV)

Esplanade des Invalides - 75007 Paris - France

The esplanade des Invalides is a vast green space located in the 7th arrondissement of Paris opposite the majestic Hôtel des Invalides. The elegant Alexandre III bridge links it to the Grand Palais on the right bank of the Seine. Its spectacular gardens flank the Hôtel des Invalides, built under Louis XIV in 1687 as a military hospital and retirement home for war veterans, and which now houses museums and the tomb of Napoleon Bonaparte.

In the heart of Paris, alongside the Grand Palais, the Eiffel Tower Stadium and the Champ-de-Mars Arena, the Invalides venue will be abuzz with the world's most prestigious sporting event and will provide a unique stage for the Olympic and Paralympic competitions over the summer of 2024.

The venue, where the Archery events will also be held, will host the finishing stages of the Marathon, which will start from the Paris Hôtel de Ville Esplanade and pass some of Paris's most stunning sites and monuments. The 42,195km race will be set against the backdrop of the Pyramid of the Louvre, the Grand Palais, the Château de Versailles, and the Eiffel Tower, among others.

At the end of this original and exceptional route, **the following services will be available to athletes:**

- mixed zone
- post-competition area with retrieval of personal items left in the call room
- cold baths
- team area and lounge for athletes and officials
- Technical Information Centre
- doping control station
- medical area

→ Trocadéro (TRO)

Situated on the right bank of the River Seine opposite the Eiffel Tower, Trocadéro (and its Esplanade) will be one of the major Olympic Games venues, hosting iconic moments - the Opening Ceremony, three (3) sport competitions with the start and finish of the Road Cycling and Race Walk events and the Marathon passing through, as well as celebrations.

The Race Walk events will be contested over a 1km loop.

The teams' areas as well as the Call Room and Post-Competition area will be set up at the Émile Anthoine Stadium, situated 500m from the start/finish area. The doping control station will be located there.



ATHLETICS TRAINING

→ General information

The Athletics training will take place at three (3) venues.

Training at the Parc des Sports Auguste Delaune and the Complexe sportif de l'Île-des-Vannes will be available from 8:00 to 13:00, and from 15:00 to 21:00.

The training schedule for the Polygone de Vincennes will be communicated later on.

There will be no training in the afternoon of the Opening Ceremony.

All training equipment will be approved by World Athletics and will comply with Rule 50 and Byelaw to Rule 50 of the IOC.

→ Facilities

Facilities at the training venues will include:

- changing rooms and showers (separate men's/women's)
- sport equipment storage
- weight training gym (Auguste Delaune Sports Centre only)
- physiotherapy areas
- medical facilities
- lounge for athletes and officials (snacks)



The training sites will also have the following specific facilities:

AUGUSTE DELAUNE SPORTS CENTRE

- two (2) Discus/Hammer cages
- one (1) Pole Vault pit
- one (1) 8-lane 400m track

COMPLEXE SPORTIF ILE DES VANNES

- two (2) Long Jump/Triple Jump pits
- two (2) High Jump landing areas
- one (1) 6-lane 400m track (8-lane straight)

POLYGONE DE VINCENNES

- one (1) 3.13km secured circuit in the Bois de Vincennes.

Access to training venues

The training venues will only be accessible to holders of an identity document and a valid Olympic accreditation (OIAC). NOC members will be granted access to one or more training venues according to the sport code(s) received as part of their mission and carried by their accreditation.

Furthermore, the IOC has rethought the concept of specific passes for training venues. This access pass will no longer exist for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, but the requirements will be integrated into the “P” accreditation quotas.

For the Polygone de Vincennes, the maximum quota of “P” accredited persons allowed is one (1) per athlete.

For the Parc des sports Auguste Delaune and the Complexe sportif de l’Île-des-Vannes, the maximum quota of “P” accredited persons allowed per venue, and per NOC, has been defined as follows:

- one (1) to five (5) accredited athletes (Aa):
one (1) “P” accredited

- six (6) to 20 accredited athletes (Aa):
three (3) “P” accredited
- 21 to 40 accredited athletes (Aa):
five (5) “P” accredited
- 41 to 60 accredited athletes (Aa):
10 “P” accredited
- 61 to 80 accredited athletes (Aa):
15 “P” accredited
- 81 to 100 accredited athletes (Aa):
20 “P” accredited
- more than 100 accredited athletes (Aa):
25 “P” accredited.

→ Food and beverage services

Given the short distance between the Olympic Village and the training venues, as well as the limited time spent by the athletes on each training venue, no food service will be offered on site. A range of snacks to take away will be available at the Olympic Village. Additionally, cold drinks (water and isotonic drinks provided by Coca-Cola) as well as hot drinks (tea and coffee) will be available at training venues.



TRANSPORT AND STORAGE OF ATHLETICS EQUIPMENT

The Paris 2024 logistics service will provide a free service to transfer athletes' sports equipment between the Olympic Village and the competition and training venues.

→ Pole transport

On their arrival at the airport, athletes must hand over their poles to the Paris 2024 staff for identification and transfer to the training venue (Auguste Delaune Sports Centre) where they will be stored and made available to the athletes, until their transfer to the competition venue the evening before the event.

The information relating to the delivery of poles travelling by road will be announced at a later date.
